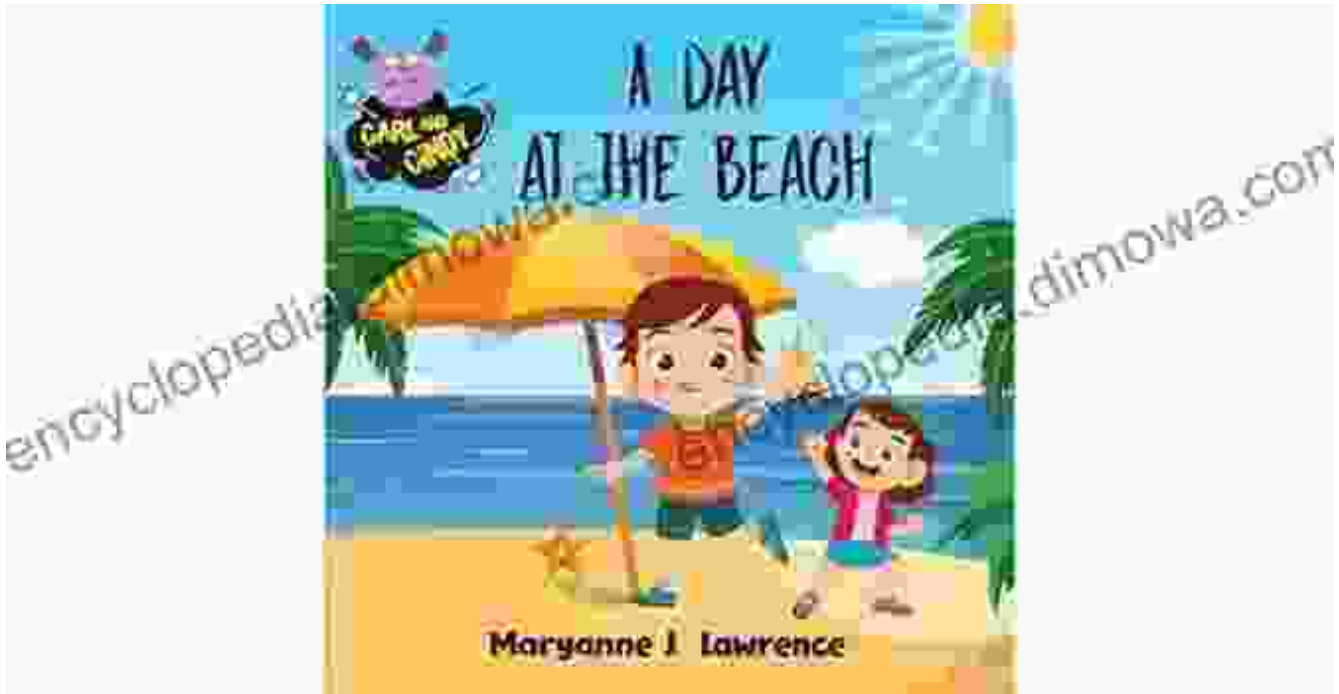

Kazantzakis was a prolific writer, producing novels, plays, poems, and

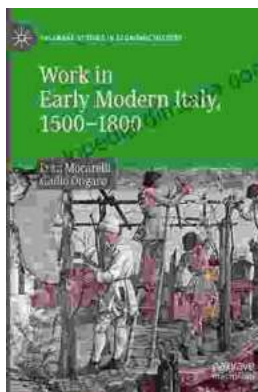
