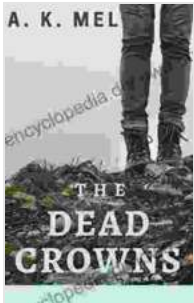

J.R.R. Tolkien was an English writer, poet, philologist, and university professor, best known as the author of *The Hobbit* and *The Lord of the Rings*.

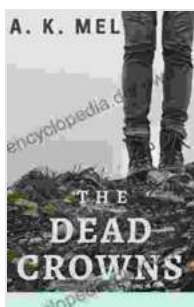
